




Our mpact



We recognise the importance of developing entrepreneurial capability early, regardless of whether participants go on to start businesses one day or be 'intrapreneurial' in careers within the private and public sector. By linking young people with inspirational role models from world-leading companies, we boost confidence, knowledge and long-term enterprise skills.

Our Access programs, Startup 54 and Entrepreneur in a Day, have equipped **+1,500 young people** with the entrepreneurial skills and confidence to grow their early-stage business idea or become intrapreneurs within their university or professional organisations. "We've always wanted to be a place where founders, creatives and anyone building interesting things can come together to drive change. Our mission is clear - building a world with no social or economic barriers to innovation. We only get there through increasing access, driving acceleration and being advocates for change. Founders come to us because we're committed to making their dreams a reality with the right support."

Startup 54

Startup 54 brings together ambitious future founders from all backgrounds to form teams, build prototypes and launch new business ventures in just 54 hours.

Participants select ideas with the most promise and make as much progress on the business as possible over the course of 54 hours. Business leaders and mentors are on hand to support teams by sharing their unique insights and experience.

Since 2018, **16** startup 54 programs have been delivered with over **100** businesses ideated, attended by **+460** young entrepreneurs with **+100** mentors and speakers, and **13** partners.

Startup 54 -Hannah's Story

"I started my company VR Calm during Startup 54. It's a virtual reality experience to help people with dementia alleviate symptoms of loneliness, depression and anxiety.

VR is such a new technology but there are so many amazing studies that show the impact it can have on people by influencing the brain and potentially improving mental wellbeing.

I wanted to bring the project to life because I felt that it could help a lot of people but I had no capital, I had no networks, and I really had no clue how to start.

At Startup 54 I met my co-founder, Samar Babiker, who is a medical student at St George's University. I also built a great network and picked up a lot of skills on how to build a business. I'm sure that VR Calm would not be the company it is today if it weren't for Startup 54. We're collecting primary data on the experiences of patients to provide further credibility for using VR Calm for therapeutic and potential publication purposes. Soon, we will be entering various primary and secondary care organisations with our product.

We're constantly honing and developing the product according to exciting emerging research surrounding dementia. We have just brought on a third member of the founding team who is leading in medical research, clinical trials and data analysis. So we're really excited about the results of our pilot phase and where we'll be going in the future."

Entrepreneur in a Day

Launched in 2019, Entrepreneur in a Day is an opportunity for students aged 12 - 16 to develop their entrepreneurial spirit and business knowledge.

Students work on live client briefs to analyse information and provide recommendations or set up a business venture. At each stage of the process, students are supported by business coaches and mentors to present their ideas to a panel of judges; further validating their talent, increasing their confidence and giving them a realistic taste of stakeholder challenges.

Since 2019:

4 programs attended by +55 young people and 5 partners have been delivered. "I learnt that an entrepreneur is not just somebody who makes a profit off what they've done, it's someone who's willing to work with others to make it better. Foundervine is important because it helps people understand business, marketing and what they might potentially get into when they're older..."



Foundervine has partnered with 8 universities to deliver idea challenges, workshops and hackathon-style events designed to support students to develop consultancy skills by responding to live client briefs or entrepreneurial skills by ideating and developing an MVP for a new business venture.

Building cicitc skils for the future

Across the UK, thriving creative and technology sectors have driven demand for digitally-skilled talent that is ready for the workplace. Yet, despite this growth, the tech start-up sector continues to perform poorly on the representation of women, people of black, Asian, minority ethnic backgrounds, D/deaf and disabled people, those with low socio-economic incomes and from LGBQTI+ communities.

While the case for diversity is well understood - increased productivity, staff retention, better products, reputation - it remains hard for some organisations to make the changes needed to optimise for inclusion, which results in great talent being wasted.

To date, we have partnered with +48 mission-driven companies to disrupt the talent landscape and provide immersive training programs that provide talented young people with the skills, experiences and mindsets needed in business.

That is why Foundervine is working towards a digital skills training agenda designed to inspire more young people into digital entrepreneurship, and improve the pool of talent available to employers.



Supporting digital skills within Westminster

Forward was an employment and training program for 18-30 year olds living and studying in Westminster and Southwark, supported by Hatch **Enterprise and The Westminster** Foundation.

Through a series of industry bootcamps and masterclasses, Foundervine supported +270 young people with the skills and knowledge to thrive in their future tech and creative careers.

"I participated in the 2-day intensive bootcamp and developed a campaign strategy for a live client brief. Building skills in South London

Lambeth Council and the Mayor of London identified a need for innovative thinking and re-skilling in response to wide scale unemployment in the borough due to the pandemic. Foundervine partnered with Lambeth Council between 2020 - 2023 to run a series of programs and events to run a series of programs and events focused on digital upskilling and entrepreneurship for Lambeth residents.

Since 2020, over **300 Lambeth residents** have attended over 62 digital skills events and programs on topics ranging from employability skills to entrepreneurship, designed to support employment opportunities and upskill talent within the community.

In June 2020, the world changed. Institutions of all kinds had voiced their support for the Black community, the Black Lives Matter movement, and were denouncing racial injustices. Wray & Nephew recognised the difficulties faced by Black communities and released a pledge, signalling a commitment to change.

Foundervine has collaborated with Wray & Nephew to build an ambitious three year program of support to local community businesses across the UK. Through over **200+ hours** of masterclasses, events and coaching opportunities, we have accelerated business growth and digital resilience for Black creatives, entrepreneurs and music businesses. The program has ultimately championed the progression of over 1,987 diverse-led businesses all over the UK.

"We've loved working with Foundervine to create Wray Forward, which continues the proud Wray & Nephew tradition of uplifting and supporting the Black-British community – in this instance, businesses and entrepreneurs, including restauranteurs and hairdressers, through to interior designers, creatives, and DJs. Our own research found that almost seven in ten (68%) Black-British entrepreneurs don't feel there's enough business tools available for them, and three-quarters (76%) feel they would have found business success much quicker if those tools had been offered - and so we hope Wray Forward is playing its part in addressing these issues.

Audrey is the CEO and founder of Kweevo, a tech startup that provides Analytics Dashboards via a SaaS model to help businesses get more value out of their data, and boost revenue and growth:

"As a solo Black Female Founder in the UK, I often felt isolated, particularly while building a tech start-up during the pandemic. One intangible and invaluable benefit I received from Barclaus Black Founder Accelerator (BFA) was the access to an incredible community of founders, leaders, experts, mentors and coaches.

For me, the cherry on the cake was attending Demo Day, where only 16 Founders were selected to introduce their business: pitching Kweevo in front of a public audience and investors such as Nick Jenkins was a remarkable and rewarding experience.


At Kweevo, we are now getting ready to fundraise and also launch a major feature - Kweevo API - in June 2022, one year after the official launch of our platform. Another brilliant milestone was our nomination at the Black Tech Achievement Awards 2022 where Kweevo ended as a finalist in the "App of the Year" category, and I won the "Innovation Champion" category with Kweevo. The amount of traction we are getting since BFA is truly amazing, and we intend to continue to grow and scale as much as possible. We currently have some exciting things on our roadmap, and we cannot wait to share them with everyone!"

Paul is the founder of Lenuity, a peer to peer secure lending platform, that focuses on helping individuals and institutions provide mortgages to their customers when selling property:

"I am a strong believer in the power of financial education and frustrated by the side effects of placing little importance on a subject that affects every aspect of modern living.

When referring to the top 1% financially most people have images of celebrities come to mind, the reality is to be in the top 1% in the UK is to have £60,000 in total assets in any form. That means that you can be in the top 1% and still can't afford to buy a flat in London.

So what does that make the 99%? Otherwise known as normal people or the average Joe, well I would say, poor & suffering.



I think everybody who doesn't want to live like normal people should have a keen interest in finance. My favourite entrepreneurs are people who create opportunities for others to be financially comfortable doing what they love to do. That's why my mission is to help create jobs, provide homes and opportunities to build wealth by unlocking the excluded economy. I am doing my best and always looking for help along the way."



Foundervine Immerse with Lloyds Bank

Foundervine's multi-year partnership with Lloyds Bank began in April 2021 to directly support the growth of black businesses across the UK with a fourweek course preparing 10 businesses for investment and linking them with potential investors.

In January 2022, Foundervine and Lloyds Bank launched Immerse, inspired by the Black. British. In Business & Proud Report 2021. It showed that black owned businesses face significant challenges in starting, growing and accessing the right support. The mission of this partnership between Foundervine and Lloyds Bank is to create an equitable landscape for Black entrepreneurs and other underrepresented founders to have the best opportunity to start, grow, adapt and thrive in their business pursuits.

Thrive with Sainsbury's

In 2022 we partnered with Sainsbury's & Mission Ventures to launch the Thrive accelerator open to any food and drink business with founders who identify as being of Black ethnicity or heritage.

Thrive was inspired by Sainsbury's recognition of the lack of diverse-led businesses on supermarket shelves and the unique barriers that they face including inadequate funding, limited access to social capital and networks, or limited industry knowledge and expertise.

As part of the Thrive programme, nine successful applicants received a welcome grant of £20,000, as well as more than 150 hours of practical 1:1 support and group learning opportunities with a variety of subject matter experts during the process. Each participant's journey was tailored to their specific needs and there was additional funding available at various stages throughout the process, up to the value of £105,000 per brand.

As one of the most important industries in the UK, representation in the grocery sector has the potential to create immense social change. Thrive with Sainsbury's opens up the possibility for Black-led brands to become household staples across the country, and to ignite conversations about supplier and supply chain diversity.

Futures in Tech with Amazon Web Services (AWS)

In 2022, Foundervine launched our first partnership with Amazon Web Services (AWS) designed to scale leaders in the digital sector. The Futures in Tech programme, delivered in collaboration with AWS, welcomed women and non-binary individuals identifying as Black. This initiative aimed to foster career development and support aspiring tech entrepreneurs.

During the pandemic, numerous women in the UK embraced fresh learning prospects, enrolling in virtual classes like coding and web development. However, the overall retention rate in various companies and opportunities remained low, primarily due to inadequate direct support and understanding.

Foundervine and AWS recognised the opportunity to build a dedicated program providing expert advice, networking and leadership develop to future leaders in technology. Over the course of four weeks, 15 talented participants were granted access to an exclusive platform where they could develop both technical expertise and soft skills. The program's design prioritised empowering the future leaders in the industry by facilitating networking opportunities, imparting cutting-edge technological knowledge, and nurturing their growth potential.

At Foundervine, we focus on building a world with no social or economic barriers to innovation. Funding remains extremely elusive for diverse and underrepresented founders.

It is clear that a lack of available growth capital, distributed fairly, remains a significant barrier towards inclusive, high growth economy. One of our main goals in the coming years is to provide our community with access to funding. The Vine Fund, Foundervine's flagship grant funding opportunity, aims to support social impact initiatives built by ambitious founders across the world. From ending extreme poverty to protecting our planet, the Fund aims to also create a more sustainable future in line

Social **Impact Fund**

The Social Impact Fund, the first initiative of the Vine Fund offered social ventures in West Africa affected by COVID-19 grants of between \$500-\$1000.

We've been working in Ghana for three years now. During that time it has been devastating

to see the impact of COVID-19 on local social impact organisations. The operations of these organisations were adversely affected by changes in the global economy, leaving many of them struggling to stay afloat. We built a small grants program designed to help some of these

organisations build a path towards financial sustainability.

The Social Impact Fund supported 16 organisations in Ghana and Nigeria of which 56% were businesses led by women with over \$10,000 awarded in grant money.

Foundervine is proud to have partnered with WeWork for over two years to offer co-working space and community support to early-stage entrepreneurs

Our partnership with WeWork, which started in the height of the pandemic in 2020, has provided the stability and structure early teams need to grow. To date, the WeWork Diverse Founders program powered by Foundervine, has provided over 200 businesses with hot desks and WeWork Labs memberships, alongside extra support and mentorship to maintain the running of their business.

We were also able to take part in events such as a pop up WeWork did for Black History Month, during that event we met our first corporate client in the agritech sector and have been working on a collaboration with them since Christmas." "We had discussions with a few different potential partners but Foundervine was really keen to build the program together and knew what they were standing for as an organisation which is really important. An accelerator for growth-stage black-led ventures

Cornerstone Partners is the first Angel Investor Network exclusively focused on investing in UK based black-owned businesses. Foundervine partnered with Cornerstone to deliver a 9-week scale-up program for 20 black-only businesses to significantly grow their network of investors, expand their business operations and absorb cutting-edge knowledge from over 30 experts and mentors. Alumni ventures on the Cornerstone 2.0 program have been featured in Forbes, The Times, BBC and are stocked in national stores such as Sainsbury's, and John Lewis which stock alumni Patrick Adom's 'Very Puzzled' Jigsaws. Munga is the founder of Gusoma Technology, an organisation that creates digital tools supporting African languages and offers ICT courses directly in African languages:

Brabners Legal Accelerator

Fueling innovation with tailored legal guidance

In partnership with Brabners law firm, Foundervine supported 25 founders through a 6-week immersive program aimed at demystifying important legal principles and providing UK-based SMEs with all relevant knowledge and skills needed to navigate the legal aspects of starting and running a business. "We are working with Foundervine to improve social mobility by removing the barriers to legal support that many budding underrepresented entrepreneurs still face today. We have put together a comprehensive legal accelerator program to equip entrepreneurs with the legal awareness and expertise to thrive."

Helping Future Founders Grow in South London

In partnership with OneTech and backed by the London Boroughs of Lambeth, Lewisham, Southwark and Wandsworth; Foundervine delivered the Stride Pre-Accelerator and Startup 54. Stride campaigns to build networks that inspire imaginations, encourage collaboration and the exchange of knowledge.

Foundervine delivered a 3-day Startup 54 program and engaged over 20 residents and students between the ages of 18 -30 to gain real-life experience in building, creating and pitching their own business. In addition to a 6-week Startup 54 preaccelerator to equip early-stage startups based in South London, with quality resources and access to business training, expert support and coaching. 40 founders were supported on business growth topics which included, defining your value proposition, customer acquisition, building a strong brand, building a sales strategy, raising capital, and pitching for success.

LIFT Survive & Pivot

In 2020 then again in 2021, OneTech and **Foundervine partnered** to deliver the Survive & Pivot incubator - an expert-led program, providing COVID-19 **Business Resilience** Support Across London. The business incubator is a 14-week program, consisting of masterclasses, accountability group sessions and a final pitching event part of the wider Leading Inclusive Futures through Technology (LIFT) program, aiming to make entrepreneurship more inclusive across Camden, Islington, Tower Hamlets and Hackney. Over 20 businesses were supported on topics such as customer discovery, finance readiness and strategy to pivot their business model and reach new customers.

Social Enterprise Support Fund (SESF)

A great number of community organizations across the UK were impacted by COVID-19. However, the chronic underfunding of minority-led social enterprises supporting COVID-19 resilience in communities had been a long-term cause for concern. It was recognised that many of these organisations struggled to maintain long-term sustainability, and the need for change became apparent.

The Social Enterprise Support Fund provided grants to help social enterprises rebuild from the challenges posed by COVID-19. The initiative was established in partnership by The National Lottery Community Fund and five social enterprise support agencies, including UnLtd. Foundervine had partnered with UnLtd to provide additional community support for founders going through the grant application process and to extend the reach of the opportunity to businesses owned by underrepresented entrepreneurs.

Together, we aimed to create a more equitable and inclusive landscape, supporting social enterprises and fostering the growth of underrepresented businesses during those trying times of the pandemic and persistent funding disparities.

Foundervine supported over 140 social enterprises in the application process. Overall, 500 enterprises in total were supported to rebuild from COVID-19 with £16.1m of funding.



Advocacy

We act as a voice for change in industry

We are witnessing a boom in UK tech, with the industry developing in hubs right on the doorstep of very diverse communities, particularly in London. To thrive, these hubs required individuals with a diversity of thought, background, and lived experience. The richness of perspectives and insights brought by people from various walks of life played a vital role in fostering innovation and driving the success of these tech hubs.

Our passion lies in being a strong voice for entrepreneurs, within the UK and beyond.

We actively engage in collaborative efforts with governments to support inclusive entrepreneurship growth in the British economy. As part of this commitment, we have become a signatory to the Tech She Can charter, founded by PwC UK, which seeks to empower women in technology roles. Our involvement in this charter places us alongside esteemed organizations such as American Express, Nesta, Channel 4, and others, collectively working towards creating a diverse talent pipeline in the tech industry.

In response to the June 2020 Black Lives Matter protests, we initiated 'The Future of the Black Economy' series, with the core purpose of promoting community economics as a means to address the impacts of racial injustice. We joined forces with the British Business Bank, actively participating in the 'Employment and Enterprise' working group, contributing valuable insights to the Commission on Race and Ethnic Disparities. This commission, established by the Prime Minister in July 2020, sought to review inequality in the UK and find avenues for positive change.

Through our participation in roundtable discussions, insightful reports, and decisive actions, we have cultivated strong relationships with national government bodies, as well as private and publicsector organisations. Our concerted efforts center on supporting underrepresented founders, addressing the barriers they face, and working collectively to build a more inclusive and thriving economy for all.



Number 10 **Downing Street**

In 2019, Foundervine was invited by the Prime Minister's Office to discuss how the government can support inclusive entrepreneurship growth in the British economy, and build the next generation of innovators. A discussion which led to the formation of the Black and Minority-ethnic SME Roundtable - a gathering of mission-driven organisations committed to building the future pipeline of diverse tech talent.

Foundervine returned to Downing Street in October 2021 to discuss the digital ecosystem and its role in building communities. The conversation was facilitated by Myles Stacey OBE and engaged a range of stakeholders from across the private sector.

In March 2022, Foundervine was invited to a roundtable policy discussion on skills and entrepreneurship with Alex Brant, MP Minister for Skills.

In April, 2022, Foundervine hosted a roundtable at 10 Downing Street in partnership with the Prime Minister's Office to discuss skills, entrepreneurship and employment opportunities. The meeting brought together key industry stakeholders including Barclays, Lloyds Banking Group, LinkedIn and BNY Mellon.

"We spoke in depth with government about the misalignment that currently exists between entrepreneurship and mainstream education, and how we could better integrate them. Entrepreneurship is built on creativity and thinking outside the box. Our education system doesn't adequately give our young people the opportunity to be creative or innovative. We need to establish a new curriculum that entrepreneurship can flourish within - a more holistic approach."

The Hamilton Commission

The Hamilton Commission was announced in June 2021, by six-time Formula One World Champion, Sir Lewis Hamilton alongside the Royal Academy of Engineering to explore areas including lack of role models and career services at schools, as well as other barriers that prevent people from more diverse backgrounds joining the motorsport industry and pursuing careers in STEM.

Foundervine CEO, Izzy Obeng was selected as one of fourteen individuals to join the commission and offer their unique insights and expertise to examine the research findings and help identify the key challenges and opportunities facing young black people entering STEM careers. "I am honoured to be part of the Hamilton Commission, collaborating with remarkable individuals to explore and address the barriers that hinder young black people from entering STEM careers. Together, we aim to create a more inclusive and diverse motorsport industry, providing opportunities and breaking down obstacles to empower the next generation of talent."






